LSCB “Practice Points” Learning Scenarios

To be discussed in Team/Group Sessions – 15 minute discussion

The LSCB Learning & Development subcommittee invite you, in team meetings or during group supervision, up to four times a year to discuss a child safeguarding issue. We encourage responses to be included in your team minutes and forwarded to the safeguarding lead within your organisation.

We hope that this is a way in which frontline staff across the city can explore some areas of learning without the need to attend formal training. It should also highlight areas of further learning.

Consider the following question, and discuss.....



A mother comes to you worried and wanting to share her concerns about the “nanny” of another child. Both families live neighbouring flats. She overheard the nanny being told that she was no good and would be sent back to her village. She could also hear the nanny crying and begging not to be sent back. And on one occasion when she collected the child from nursery, she asked about “how she could obtain a new passport”

What would you do to assist this young person?



Points for discussion:

How would you progress this matter?

Would you advise the family of your concerns?

How would you assess the risks?

What further information do you want from the mother and child?

What is your role in this situation?

Do you require further information from other agencies?
