LSCB - “Practice Points” Learning Scenarios

To be discussed in Team/Group Sessions – 15 minute discussion

A small child aged about 3 years old is brought to your attention. You see what appear to be small almost circular bruises on the child’s upper arms. The child says that they got them climbing trees in their garden.



What would you do to assist this young person and or his family?



Points for discussion:

How would you progress this matter?

What further information would you like from the family or child/young person?

Would you advise the family of your concerns?

How would you assess this risk?

Do you require any further information from other agencies and how might you obtain this?

What is your role in this situation?
